WHAT IS EPR?

EPR shifts the cost of recycling and waste management from taxpayers to producers of packaging materials. Extended Producer Responsibility (EPR) laws require companies to report and pay fees for the packaging they use. With California, Colorado and Oregon enforcing EPR, and more states coming, most companies will be affected, making immediate compliance essential.

KEY UPCOMING EPR DEADLINES

- Colorado: Report Due July 31st 2025
- California: Report Due Aug 3rd 2025


